## **Bread & Wine Celebration | Saturday, April 11 at 12:00pm**

*In the Courtyard following St. Basil's Liturgy at 9am*

### **What to Bring**

A basket with bread(sliced and ready to share), your favorite bottle of wine, wine glasses/cups, wine bottle opener and/or apple juice.

Before Liturgy begins, place your basket of bread and wine at the designated table in the hallway. After Liturgy, take your basket to the courtyard to enjoy at the tables.

### **Reminder**

While the morning Liturgy carries a sense of anticipation, we are still in the midst of Holy Week and awaiting the celebration of Pascha. Out of reverence for the day, please keep the atmosphere calm and appropriate to Holy Saturday. Please remember to clean up after yourselves.

### **What to Bring**

A Pascha basket with traditional items such as bread, wine, meat, cheese, sweet treats, and other items you and your family enjoy, along with plates, cups, napkins, and utensils. Sharing is encouraged! A white tablecloth will be provided for each table.

### **Pascha Reminders**

- Arrive early before the 10pm Rush Service on Saturday evening to drop off your Pascha basket at your table or designated storage spot.
- After the Paschal meal, please clean up after yourselves. There will be a dumpster in the back parking lot.
